**Sept 25 – As the year of Shmittah 5782 comes to a close, it's important to remember a special mitzvah that we only have once every seven years.** Even though those who live outside of Israel did not have the opportunity to let their land lie fallow during the year of Shmittah, there is a mitzvah that does apply to us. Shmitas Kesafim, to cancel all debts at the end of the Shmittah year. To observe this mitzvah properly, it is important to execute a special document, a Pruzbul, to avoid the cancelation of any debts that you don't want to have cancelled. **Please see the flyers section for the current Halacha that explains the source and the workings of the Pruzbul, as well as instructions for how to execute a pruzbul.** On Sunday, Sept 25, there will be a Beis Din available at Aish to create a pruzbul in person which is the best option. If you can't make it, please see the instructions and document to create a pruzbul remotely.
